

## **October 2005**

### **Summary**

#### DAILY Notes

Temperature: On the 27th a maximum temperature of 20.5c was recorded, this was the highest maximum recorded during late October (21st to 31st) in the past 35 years (Bracknell Harman's water data) equal to the 26th October 1969 and higher than in any other late October day since local records began in 1904.

The highest minimum (15.8c on 12th) was the 2nd highest in 35 years of Bracknell Harman's water data, with only 16.0c on 3rd 1985 higher. A minimum of 14.6c on the 3rd was the 9th highest reading in 35 years of records for October.

Rainfall: The highest fall of 20.9mm on the 24th was the highest October fall since 29th 2000 when 50.3mm fell.

#### MONTHLY Station Notes

Temperature: Mean maximum (17.3c) and mean minimum (10.3c) were both the 2nd highest in 35 years of October data at this station. The mean 13.8c was also the 2nd highest beaten by 2001 at 13.9c.

Rainfall: October's rainfall 72.8mm was average (1971-2000) but still the highest total since October 2004.
